



Not all breasts *are the same...*

About 40% of women have dense breast tissue. Having dense breasts is normal, but puts you at higher risk of breast cancer.

For women with dense tissue, mammography alone may not be enough to find breast cancer.

When used in combination with mammography, Automated Breast Ultrasound (ABUS) greatly enhances detection of cancer in dense breast tissue.

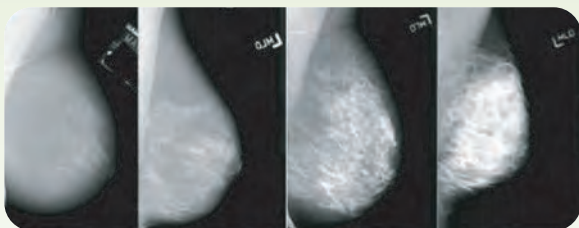
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THERE ARE FOUR DENSITY CATEGORIES.

On a mammogram, dense tissue and cancers both appear white, so a cancer may be hidden by dense tissue. When dense tissue is scanned with ultrasound, tissue appears light and cancers appear dark, making them easier to see.

You Can Benefit from an ABUS exam.

It takes about 20 minutes, and does not require compression or radiation. You'll be resting on your stomach while the scanner obtains the images.
