Mammogram Guidelines

- Specific focus of clinical concern, including a palpable mass or thickening, induration, axillary lymphadenopathy, bloody nipple discharge, skin changes, or focal pain.
- Recommended short term follow up for probable benign radiologic findings (3 month or 6 month follow up)
- Previous treatment for breast cancer as directed by oncologic team (surgeon, oncologist, radiologist, radiation oncologist)
- Further evaluation of finding(s) identified at screening exam

SCREENING

Mammogram Guidelines

- All asymptomatic women 40 years of age or older, including women with breast implants
- Asymptomatic women younger than 40 who are at increased risk of breast cancer
- Women with bilateral, cyclic, and/or non-focal breast pain
- Asymptomatic women who have undergone diagnostic imaging, surgery or biopsy with subsequent normal or benign exam (BI-RADS 1 or 2), including:
 - Women who have had a diagnostic exam who may return to screening.
 - Women who have had a unilateral mastectomy.
 - Women who have had a benign biopsy.
